With over 83% of our A-level cohort achieving A*-C grades in 2022, our students consistently secure admission into their first-choice universities, as well as gaining opportunities for supported internships anddegree apprenticeships.

In our sixth form, students have access to a diverse range of extra-curricular activities designed to foster personal growth and development. From the Paris 'Your Future in Europe' program to the 'World First' Greenland Expedition, we offer unique opportunities for students to broaden their horizons and explore new cultures and environments.

Exciting enrichment programme

Curriculum

With almost 30 subjects on offer, students design their own learning path based on their skills, talents, and aspirations.

Students are encouraged to select subjects relevant to interests, aptitude and their career ambitions. Most students study three subjects, with the option to take an Extended Project Qualification. This is largely self-directed, and, as well as the chance to be creative, an EPQ can give students the edge when it comes to that all-important UCAS or job application.

Students are taught in small, focused groups across classroom and lecture spaces, including our Sixth Form Centre, with seminar rooms, screens for crossworld interactive experiences and well-equipped café bar.

Supported by our strong team of experienced subject specialists, as well as by a personal Sixth Form tutor, students are encouraged to manage their time effectively, developing skills to take on to higher education and careers.

Although most of the subjects we offer are at A level, we have a small, but growing number of vocational qualifications.

Currently offered across Food & Nutrition, Science, Business and Sport, we have plans to introduce a broader vocational curriculum as demand grows, from both students themselves, and the industries they will eventually join.




Beyond the Classroom


